Please read your child's attendance tracker carefully. If your child's attendance is **below 90%** they are classed, by the **Department for Education**, as a **Persistent Absentee**. This group of children nationally **do not achieve as well as their peers**. Schools are duty bound to work with, **support and challenge all Persistent Absentees**. The school's Attendance Committee are meeting with Diane Enderby, our Education Welfare Officer, next Monday to review all Persistent Absentees. Mrs Enderby will be corresponding with all the families with Persistent Absentee children and parents/carers **may be asked to attend an Attendance Panel meeting.**
